We are approaching Thanksgiving – traditionally a time to give thanks for the harvest and for the year just past. We at St. Matt's have much to give thanks for, especially the love we have experienced and shared through what has been a hard year for us, the nation, and much of the world. The word



"Thanksgiving" describes the day but, at the same time, calls us to respond to the blessings that God has given us: to give God praise and share our blessings with our community. St. Matt's continues to support that community through Backpack Buddies, the Care Response Team, and the many examples of care that we have shared with you during our online services.

During the past month, special meetings were held to identify additional needs in our community and to discuss ways that St. Matt's could help. This led to Vestry agreement on a range of new initiatives, which include: providing gift cards to local teachers for their dedication and commitment, especially during these challenging times; funding for a Children's Wellness Coordinator to assist local children who are experiencing a difficult time during the pandemic; donations to several local organizations working to support our local community; and financing to undertake essential work on the church building and trailer. We thank you for your ongoing support that allows us to undertake these projects.

We are also busy planning this year's Advent and Christmas services which will, for the most part, be online, but we are planning an outdoor Christmas Day service on the church grounds – more on this and the Christmas program later.


